
Which Region are you Located in?



Helpful tips for current students

- ➤ Pace yourself! Take each week as a new opportunity to regroup and refocus
- > Sleep is critical! So are adequate nutrition, exercise, and mental health practices
- ➤ Get out of your room! Take advantage of social or leisure opportunities on campus
- ► Go to class! Missing class means missing instructions, explanations, updates
- > Take advantage of supports! Go to office hours. Go to tutors. Go to study support offices.
- >Start work early! Work takes longer than you anticipate. Start now and work in stages.
- **Communicate often!** If you don't explain, no one will know. If you don't ask, no one will answer
- Expand your study habits! Reading over notes is not enough. Memorizing is insufficient.
- ➤ Critical thinking is essential! Learn it well enough to explain, differentiate, analyze, & apply

➤Thinking about college?

- > Develop consistent sleep routines
- ➤ Start managing your own medication regimes
- ➤ Become reliable setting and responding to alarms
- ➤ Practice reading *and* answering email, daily
- ➤ Start monitoring! Double check work, dates, times, places...
- ➤ Visit campus! Walk around, look at things, imagine yourself there
- > Learn and talk about the types and amounts of support you get at home, and school
- >Anticipate reading, writing, learning, thinking, and applying content at University level
- > Prepare to apply: Neuropsych eval, IEP/504, Application forms https://www.eiu.edu/step/
